Vendor Categories:

Grower: May sell products they have grown, including vegetables, herbs, fruit, etc.

Producer: Includes prepared, ready to eat food, processed & packaged meat, honey, and baked goods.

Maker: Jewelers, artists, bead workers, seamstresses, and essentially anyone who makes something original by hand.

All other Vendors/artisans: *May NOT sell any product(s) containing any measurable amount of THC or alcohol in any form.*

2025 Vendor Booth Space Fees

Vendors may sign up for individual markets or sign up for the entire season. There is no charge for your booth if you are a Southern Ute tribal member or 1st descendant. Each booth space will be \$10 in advance or \$15 the day of the market. We are also not charging any vendor **selling produce**. Once we have received the completed application back from you, the registration link will be sent to you to register for your market dates.

Vendor Rules & Regulations

- Vendor spaces with access to power are limited. We recommend that you sign up early if this is a requirement.
- Booth spaces are assigned by Southern Ute Economic Development and are non-transferrable.

- Vendors must bring their own 10x10 pop up tent, tables, chairs, & whatever else they require for their 12X12 space.
- Absolutely no ALCHOL or MARIJUANA sales are allowed, this includes any marijuana-based products. If you have any questions about a product you sell, please discuss it with market personnel in advance.
- Vendors are expected to always operate in a professional and courteous manner. Derogatory language directed at customers, other vendors or their products, and/or market personnel will not be tolerated.
- The Southern Ute Indian Tribe requires every vendor to carry their own general liability insurance.
- In addition to these Rules and Regulations, all vendors must comply with those set by the Southern Ute Indian Tribe, county, and state (if applicable).

Vendor Agreement

- I certify that the information provided is accurate, and that my products and business are compliant with applicable laws.
- I understand and agree to all terms and conditions outlined in the 2025 Vendor Rules and Regulations.
